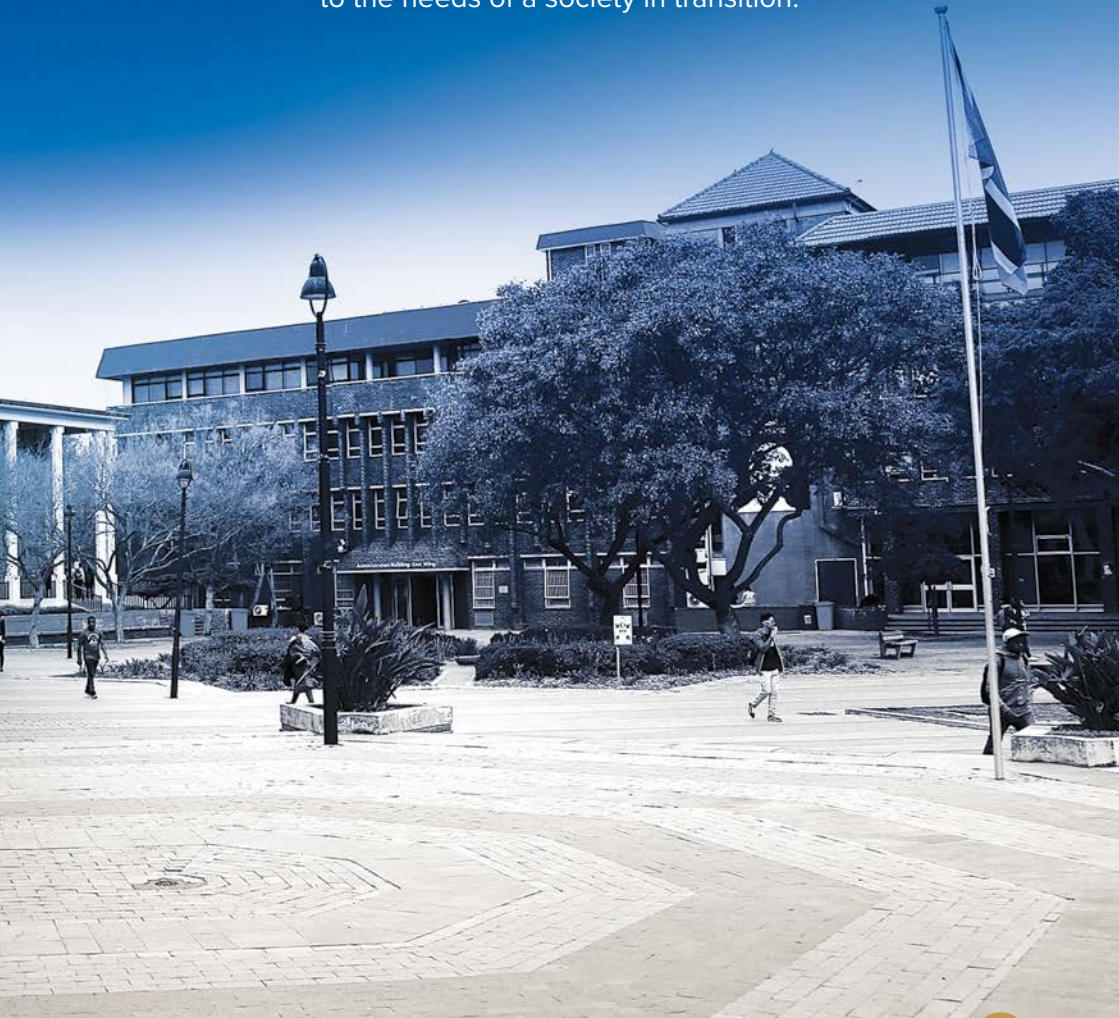

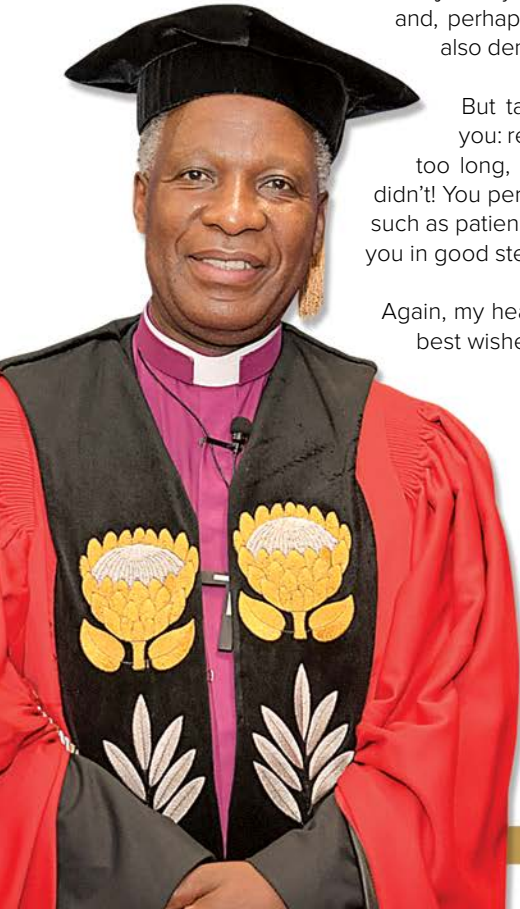

Even now, with the imminent threat of the COVID-19 pandemic behind us, the uncertainty of that time seems to linger.

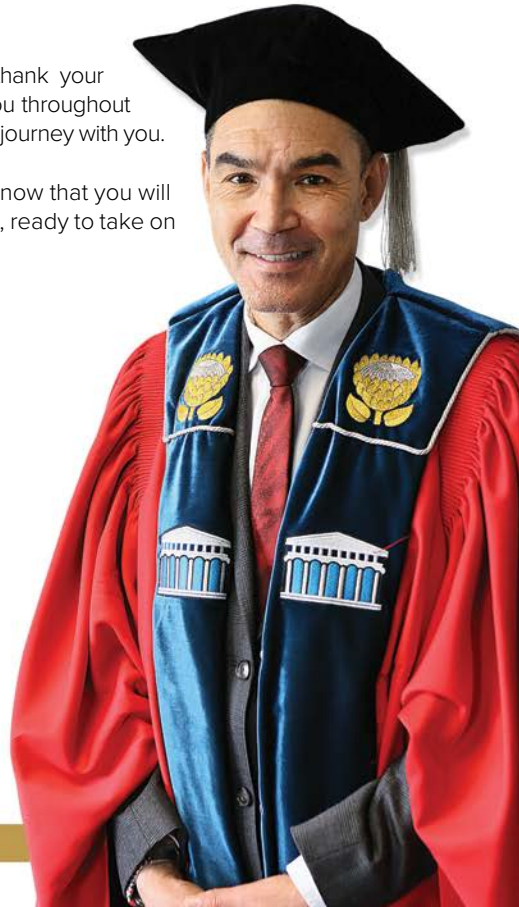
It makes it then even more important to use moments such as these to reflect on how we did not allow defeatism to set in, but rather how we determined our way to get to this point.

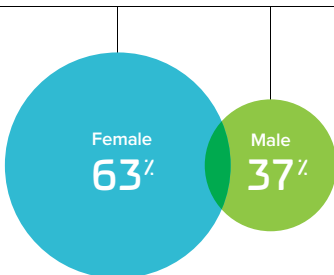

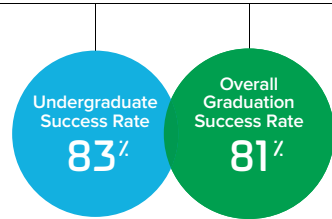

1367 INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS are enrolled at UWC.



1960: The University College of the Western Cape opens its doors.

1970: The institution gains independent university status and is allowed to award its own degrees and diplomas.

1975: Prof Richard van der Ross is appointed as UWC's first black Rector.

1978: UWC's Cape Flats Nature Reserve is declared a National Monument (now known as a provincial heritage site).

1987: New Rector and Vice-Chancellor, Prof Jakes Gerwel, declares UWC as the 'university of the left'. The University deracialises and opens its doors to African students.

UWC inaugurates its longest-serving Chancellor, Archbishop Desmond Tutu, who would serve for more than 25 years.

1990: UWC becomes the first university to award the late President Mandela an honorary doctorate upon his release from prison.

1994: Many academics from UWC join President Mandela's government and are appointed to ministerial and advisory positions, including its Rector, Prof Gerwel, who became the Director-General in the Presidency.

UWC's leadership takes part in writing the higher education policy for the incoming government. The South African interim Constitution and final Constitution are drafted at UWC.

1995: UWC launches its first website – joining the internet age before other universities in the Mother City.

UWC launches the Institute for Poverty, Land and Agrarian Studies (PLAAS) to engage in research, training, policy development and advocacy in relation to land reform, rural governance and natural resource management.

2002: Under the leadership of Rector and Vice-Chancellor, Prof Brian O'Connell, UWC successfully resists being merged. Instead, its Dentistry Faculty is merged with that of the University of Stellenbosch, making UWC the only dentistry faculty in the Western Cape.

2010: 10 SARChI chairs awarded to UWC, the highest number awarded to any university in SA that year (as of 2018, UWC hosts 17 SARChI Chairs).

2012: UWC launches its Technology Transfer Office to help promote the development and protection of the intellectual property of the University's research community, staff and students.

UWC is declared Africa's Greenest Campus in the inaugural African Green Campus Initiative Challenge.

2013: UWC signs the Berlin Declaration on Open Access in the Sciences and Humanities, joining hundreds of institutions around the world dedicated to supporting the principles of open access and working to achieve openness in publicly funded projects.



HISTORIC MILESTONES

2015: Prof Tyrone Pretorius is inaugurated as the new Rector and Vice-Chancellor.

2016: UWC's Centre for Humanities Research is awarded the Flagship on Critical Thought in African Humanities by the NRF.

UWC is ranked number 1 in Physical Science – not just in South Africa, but for Africa as a whole – in the 2016 Nature Index.

2017: A group of UWC students, led by Prof Nico Orce, conduct the **second major African-led experiment** at the CERN laboratory in Switzerland.

UWC's former Vice-Chancellor, Prof Brian O'Connell, receives the National Research Foundation's highest honour, the NRF Lifetime Achievement Award.

2018: UWC's Faculty of Dentistry - Africa's leading and largest dental school - launches a new **state-of-the-art video conferencing system** that will allow students to watch live surgeries in class or at home - a first for South Africa.

2019: UWC Rugby makes its debut in the Varsity Cup. The team makes history by becoming the **first historically disadvantaged institution to qualify for the premier university rugby competition.**

2020: UWC's South African National Bioinformatics Institute (SANBI), in collaboration with researchers from the National Institute for Communicable Diseases (NICD), sequenced the first SARS-COV-2 genome in South Africa, providing a genetic "fingerprint" helped us understand - and contain - the spread of COVID-19.

2022: Professor Russell H Kaschula is appointed as the Research Chair in Forensic Linguistics and Multilingualism – a first in Africa.

The UWC Main Hall is renamed the Jakes Gerwel Hall to honour this iconic leader.

UWC launches the first football league for young girls called She-Bobo.

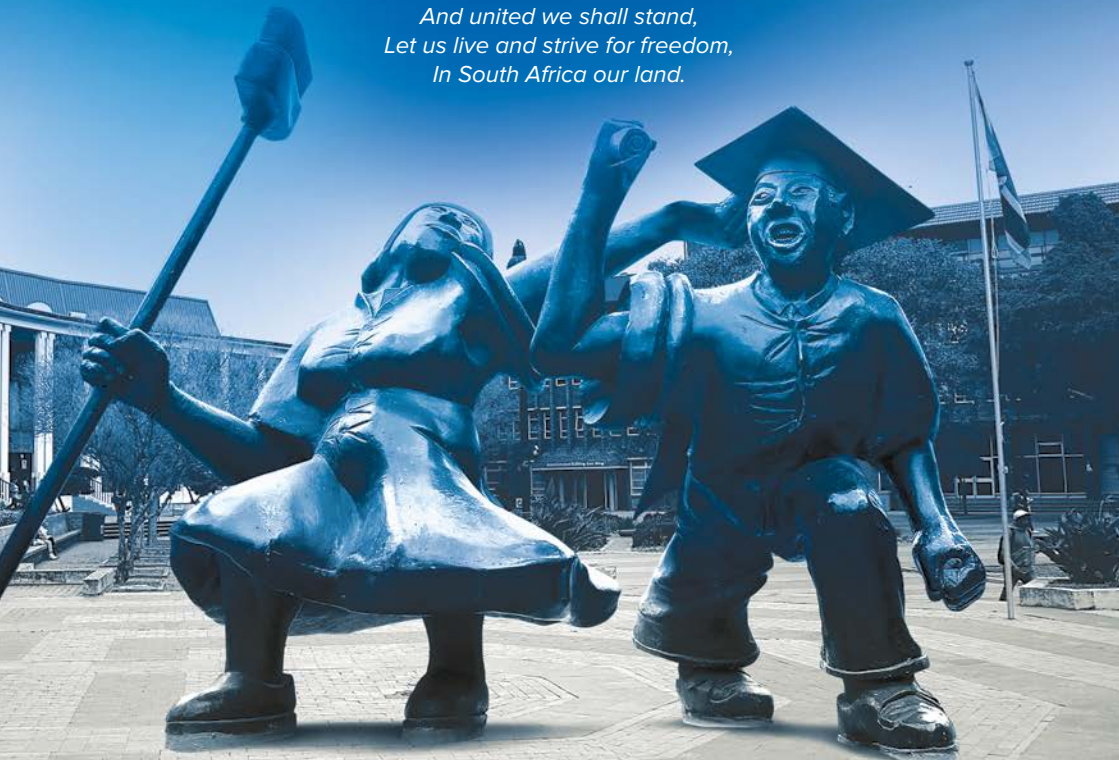

A Capability Analysis of academic support of NC(V) students at public TVET colleges in the Western Cape

Description:

Sasman applied the capability approach to explicate effectiveness and interconnectedness of the academic support given to students at TVET colleges. She made use of evaluative and effective reasoning to determine how students' freedoms are enhanced and if free agency is enhanced in student experience. She problematized the on-course academic support phase and found that the constitutive part of development is lacking and that the functioning space does not optimise the productive qualities of students. She contributed further by designing an Academic Student Support Framework to converge the efforts of functionaries and lecturers in TVET colleges, with a focus on transforming the functioning space of NC(V) students in South Africa.

Investigating an incremental implementation of African Language programme: A case of two primary schools in South Africa

Description:

This innovative study investigates the Incremental Introduction of African Languages (IIAL) program in relation to teaching of isiXhosa in Grade two classes. The thesis speaks to the complexity of multilingualism in South Africa where African languages are often given a lower status than English and Afrikaans. The teaching of African languages as additional languages forms part of this study. The research sought to find the teaching strategies used by isiXhosa teachers in implementing IIAL to multilingual learners from different linguistic backgrounds, and the type of support given to teachers by the Department of Basic Education (DBE) in implementing IIAL. This relatively new program is meant to focus on the development of African Languages to accommodate language diversity.

Grade R teachers' conception and implementation of free Play within the Curriculum and Assessment Policy Document

Description:

The study investigated Grade-R teachers' perceptions of free play within the Curriculum and Assessment Policy Statement (CAPS) in selected schools in the Western Cape. A qualitative study was conducted using multiple case studies. The Bio-ecological systems theory, the theory of Intentionality and the Assets based theory informed the study. The participants included Grade R teachers, the HODs and school Principals. The implementation of free play was observed in the classrooms. The study found that majority of teachers were not familiar with CAPS, lacked resources and the abilities to implement it.

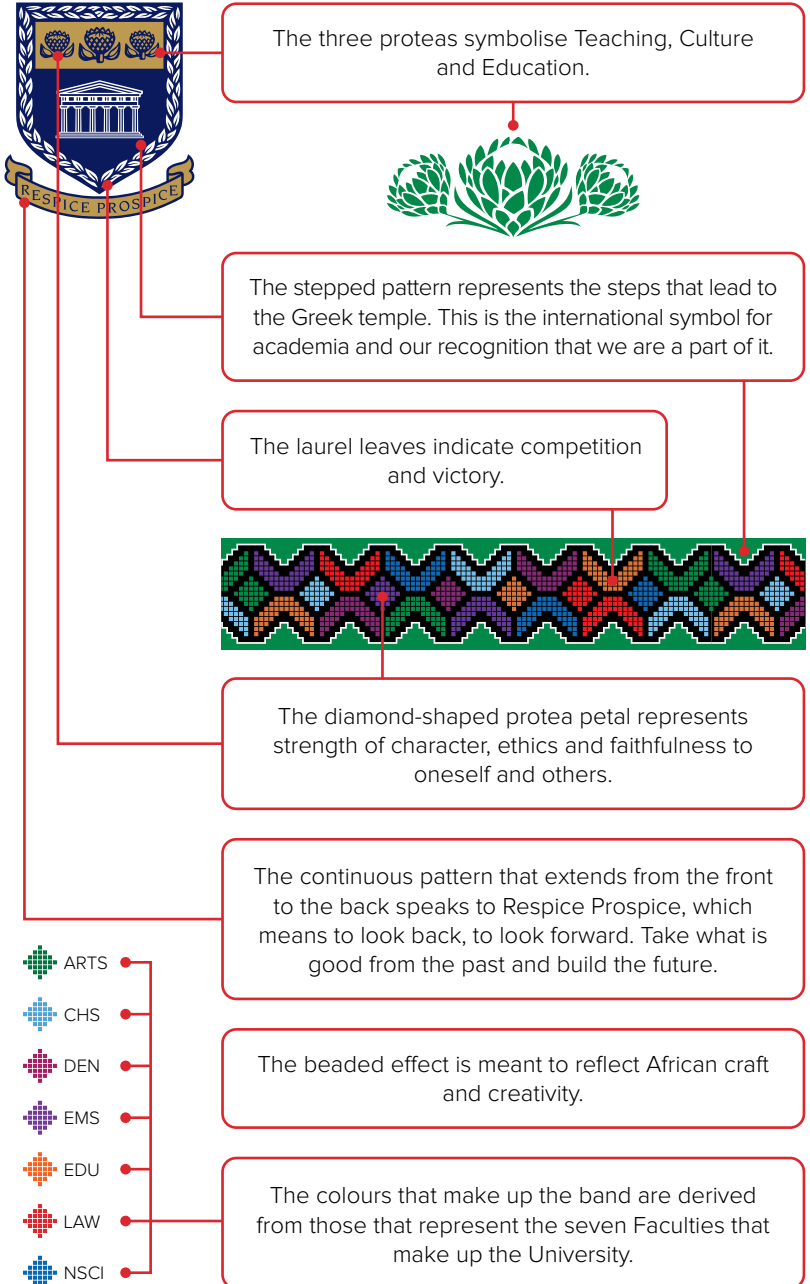
