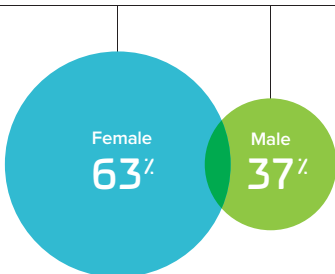

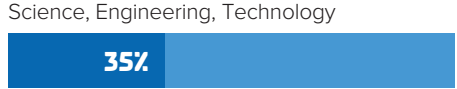
### GENDER

% of total student population

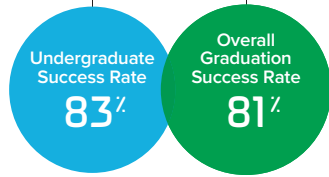


### ENROLMENT

## HISTORIC MILESTONES

### UNIVERSITY OF THE WESTERN CAPE



**1960:** The University College of the Western Cape opens its doors.

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**1970:** The institution gains independent university status and is allowed to award its own degrees and diplomas.

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**1975:** Prof Richard van der Ross is appointed as UWC's first black Rector.

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**1978:** UWC's Cape Flats Nature Reserve is declared a National Monument (now known as a provincial heritage site).

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**1987:** New Rector and Vice-Chancellor, Prof Jakes Gerwel, declares UWC as the 'university of the left'. The University deracialises and opens its doors to African students.

UWC inaugurates its longest-serving Chancellor, Archbishop Desmond Tutu, who would serve for more than 25 years.

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**1990:** UWC becomes the first university to award the late President Mandela an honorary doctorate upon his release from prison.

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**1994:** Many academics from UWC join President Mandela's government and are appointed to ministerial and advisory positions, including its Rector, Prof Gerwel, who became the Director-General in the Presidency.

UWC's leadership takes part in writing the higher education policy for the incoming government. The South African interim Constitution and final Constitution are drafted at UWC.

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**1995:** UWC launches its first website – joining the internet age before other universities in the Mother City.

UWC launches the Institute for Poverty, Land and Agrarian Studies (PLAAS) to engage in research, training, policy development and advocacy in relation to land reform, rural governance and natural resource management.

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**2002:** Under the leadership of Rector and Vice-Chancellor, Prof Brian O'Connell, UWC successfully resists being merged. Instead, its Dentistry Faculty is merged with that of the University of Stellenbosch, making UWC the only dentistry faculty in the Western Cape.

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**2010:** 10 SARChI chairs awarded to UWC, the highest number awarded to any university in SA that year (as of 2018, UWC hosts 17 SARChI Chairs).

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**2012:** UWC launches its Technology Transfer Office to help promote the development and protection of the intellectual property of the University's research community, staff and students.

UWC is declared Africa's Greenest Campus in the inaugural African Green Campus Initiative Challenge.

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**2013:** UWC signs the Berlin Declaration on Open Access in the Sciences and Humanities, joining hundreds of institutions around the world dedicated to supporting the principles of open access and working to achieve openness in publicly funded projects.

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## HISTORIC MILESTONES

### UNIVERSITY OF THE WESTERN CAPE

**2015:** Prof Tyrone Pretorius is inaugurated as the new Rector and Vice-Chancellor.

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**2016:** UWC's Centre for Humanities Research is awarded the Flagship on Critical Thought in African Humanities by the NRF.

UWC is ranked number 1 in Physical Science – not just in South Africa, but for Africa as a whole – in the 2016 Nature Index.

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**2017:** A group of UWC students, led by Prof Nico Orce, conduct the **second major African-led experiment** at the CERN laboratory in Switzerland.

UWC's former Vice-Chancellor, Prof Brian O'Connell, receives the National Research Foundation's highest honour, the NRF Lifetime Achievement Award.

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**2018:** UWC's Faculty of Dentistry - Africa's leading and largest dental school - launches a new **state-of-the-art video conferencing system** that will allow students to watch live surgeries in class or at home - a first for South Africa.

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**2019:** UWC Rugby makes its debut in the Varsity Cup. The team makes history by becoming the **first historically disadvantaged institution to qualify for the premier university rugby competition.**

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**2020:** UWC's South African National Bioinformatics Institute (SANBI), in collaboration with researchers from the National Institute for Communicable Diseases (NICD), sequenced the first SARS-COV-2 genome in South Africa, providing a genetic "fingerprint" helped us understand - and contain - the spread of COVID-19.

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**2022:** Professor Russell H Kaschula is appointed as the Research Chair in Forensic Linguistics and Multilingualism – a first in Africa.

The UWC Main Hall is renamed the **Jakes Gerwel Hall** to honour this iconic leader.

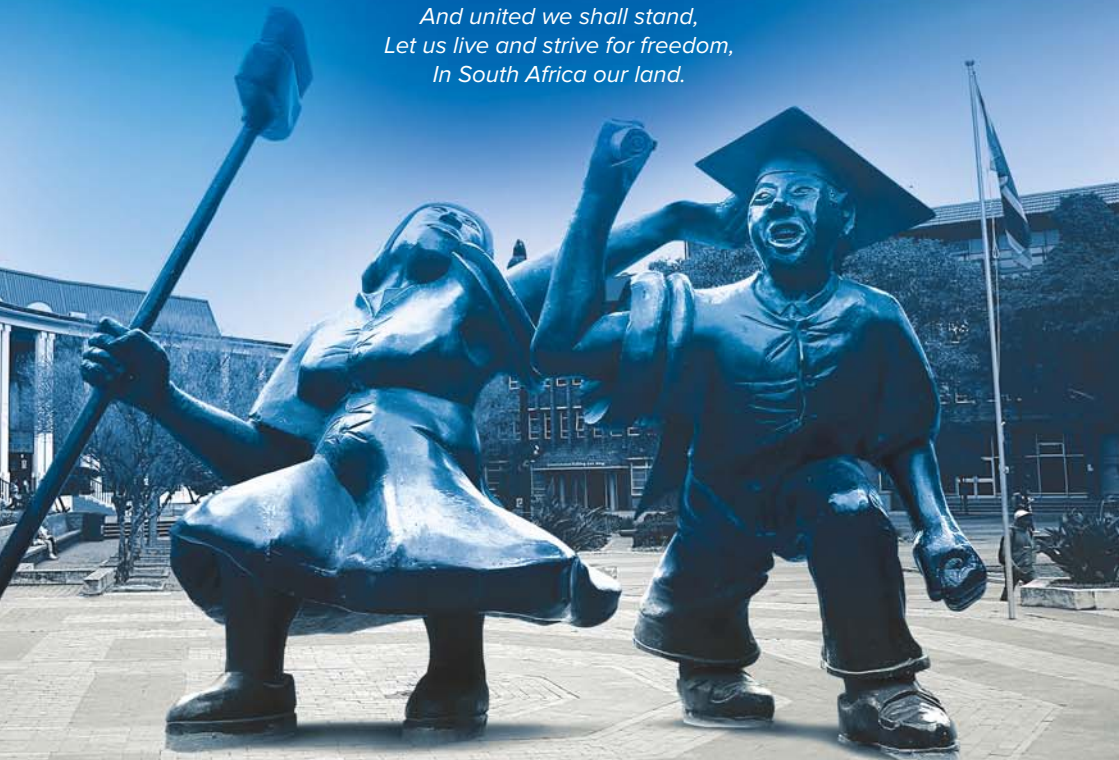

The Changing Nature of Strategic Research Management at Selected South African Universities, 1997-2007

#### Description:

This study investigates changes in the nature of research management in three South African universities from 1997 to 2007. It analyses institutional change strategies and the emergence of universities as strategic actors as they sought to respond to post-apartheid policy, planning and funding steering mechanisms. The emergence of strategic actorhood is evident in a shift in the approach to research management, from a facilitatory to a more directive mode. The case studies demonstrate how the ambiguities around university leaders' strategic choices determine organisational action at three levels – senior leadership, deans, academics – across which initiatives to redress historical inequalities often compete with the new public management reform agenda and a marketised higher education.

Mediating children's development through storytelling and play activities: a socio-cultural study of a Waldorf kindergarten in Cape Town

#### Description:

The study investigated the role of storytelling in early childhood development and the connection with free imaginative play of children. It utilised socio-cultural theories of Lev Vygotsky as a theoretical lens, specifically the critical role of social interaction in children's learning – a continuous process that is profoundly influenced by culture. Imitation, guided learning and collaborative learning feature prominently in his theory. The study was conducted in a Waldorf kindergarten and centred on the internalisation of language in storytelling and its expression in play. The findings accentuate the alignment between internalisation of language with imagination, zone of proximal development, private speech, self-regulation and identity formation.

### Thesis:

Rethinking representation of African identity and belonging in a selection of south African writings

### Description:

The thesis foregrounds the representation of identity politics in a selection of works by black South African writers from 1930 to 1990, with a specific focus on Herbert Dhlomo, Bloke Modisane, Wally Serote, Laurretta Ngcobo, Phaswane Mpe and Black Consciousness poets, Oswald Mtshali and Sipho Sepamla. The thesis transcends the race-based theoretical premise on identity and makes an alternate exploration of space as a cultural signifier in manifesting identity politics. The study analysed the texts through a decolonial lens with particular emphasis on power and resistance, and affirms black protest writings as sites for defiance against marginality, racial oppression and violation of human rights.

Publishing in English and its implications for researchers and higher education institutions in multilingual contexts in Africa: A multiple case study

### Description:

The thesis examined the impact of publishing research in English at non-Anglophone African universities. It highlighted the complexity of language on research quality and quantity, access to resources, the decolonisation and internationalisation of research, and the shift towards research-intensive universities. There is a marked tension between English as gateway to global knowledge systems and linguistic injustice. Bibliometric data was used to assess language and research publishing landscapes and provided robust case descriptions and qualitative data. Bourdieu's notion of language as a form of cultural capital resonates with the perception of English as an essential asset in spite of the significant burden it places on scientists who speak a different first language.

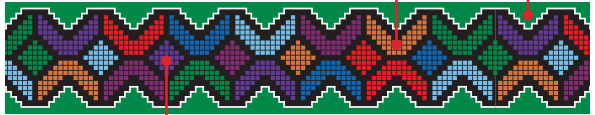


The three proteas symbolise Teaching, Culture and Education.

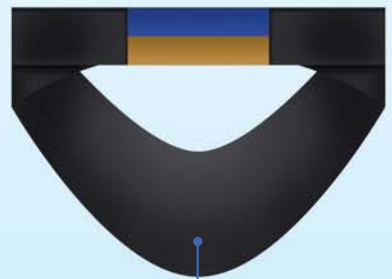

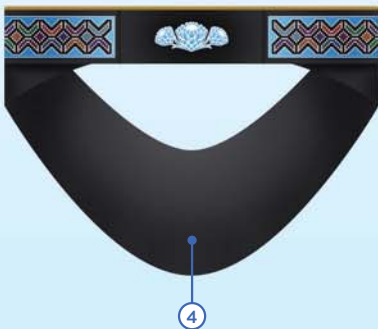

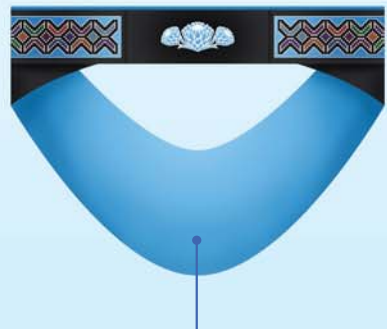
